Certificate in Testicular Ultrasound

Thank you for your interest in the second BAUS and Leeds & West Yorkshire Radiology Academy certificate in testicular ultrasound. This is an exciting joint venture between West Yorkshire Radiology and Urology with an aim to take you from novice to independent practitioner in testicular ultrasound. The first course was very successful and we now have 10 trainees completing their training at their base hospital.

There follows a description of the certificate including entry criteria and application form.

Who is it aimed at?

Doctors currently in higher specialist training in Urology, Consultant and Non Consultant Grade Urological Surgeons. It is aimed to create independent ultrasonographers practicing under the umbrella of a Radiology department.

Places are limited to 15 students only on a first come basis.

Certificate Structure

- Residential taught course at The Academy based at Leeds General Infirmary on **Thursday 11th and Friday 12th of March 2010**
- Mentor led teaching at your base hospital with a minimum of 50 cases.
- Assessment including a Portfolio, image examination and assessment of practice either locally or on return to Leeds. **The certificate requires completion and passing of all 3 components.**

Taught course

2 full days of lectures, "live-feed" examinations, hands on scanning, image libraries and quizzes within the purpose built Leeds and West Yorkshire Radiology Academy, based at the Leeds General Infirmary (www.radiologyacademy.com)

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Mentored training at your base hospital

Before acceptance on the certificate you need to have found a mentor at your base hospital who will support your application. They will be responsible for your supervised hands on teaching at your hospital but not necessarily delivering it all. There is never a fixed numbers of examinations you need to perform to reach competency but you should aim for 50 as a minimum. These would be on supervised lists, the majority ideally with your mentor.

We would be most happy discuss the certificate with your proposed mentor.

Assessment

This is the final component and comprises;

1. A portfolio: Log book, formative assessment, reflective practice
2. Image examination: either upon return to Leeds or at your base hospital
3. Clinical assessment: either upon return to Leeds or at your base hospital with a Consultant Radiologist independent of your mentor.

Cost

£400 including taught course, course dinner, portfolio, assessment material.
